"When the time drew near for David to die, he gave a charge to Solomon his son. "I am about to go the way of the earth," he said. So be strong, act like a man, and observe what the Lord your God requires: Walk in obedience to him, and keep his decrees and commands, his laws and regulations, as written in the Law of Moses. Do this so that you prosper in the Lord..." I Kings 2:1-3a

King David is an old man and he knows that his time on earth is drawing to a close. He has spent 40 years on the throne of Israel, 7 as king in Hebron and 33 as king Jerusalem. Now he is at the end of his rule. He has already had Solomon crowned king as to achieve a smooth transition of power. He has taken care of his throne, but now he leaves Solomon this last piece of advice.

First of all, he is reminded to be Strong. Leadership is never for the faint of heart, and the kingship in Israel required

Sanctuary Update given by Chris Carpenter. The Choir Loft/ Chancel area flooring was placed, sanded and stained. The Sanctuary Committee is concerned about the final quality and color, they will be seeking to correct via the Contractor at no cost. This may delay the project several weeks, however feel this is necessary. Update on items still required (ADA double doors, interior handrail, AV cabinet, Chancel furniture, electrical trim). Permission to purchase choir chair cushion fabric to match pew cushions requested at a max Motion to of \$631. approve fabric cost by Frank Snider, seconded by Susan Stewart. Approved. Stain glass windows need minor repair and maintenance, quote has been received by original company (Laws Stained Glass). Request of up to \$800 for stain glass repairs requested. Motion made by Matthew Hawn, seconded by Frank Snider. Approved. Allweather floor mats were discussed and quote provided.

Consistory suggested a sample be ordered due to total cost. Request made to Faye Painter to provide information for **Sanctuary Dedication Program**. Check draw #7 for contractor Hemlock requested and approved - \$6,676.38.

Update given by Waterline Candace Carpenter. A thank you to Property Committee for repairing hole. Power line to Church was cut but repaired same day. In communication with Lincoln County in hopes of uncovering a grant or reimbursement for shortage of funds - unfortunately, no movement to date. Contractor, JITOW, was onsite all week for in-ground installation. Next step is to conduct pressure and bacteria test with Lincoln County within the next 2 weeks (if schedules/ weather align). Second (and final) payment to JITOW will be due upon all County sign-offs. Discussion and Consistory consensus that City Water should be provided to the Parsonage.

Personnel Committee Update given by Marilyn McRee and LaDonna Goodson. Two members of Personnel meet with Church Staff to review job descriptions and discuss concerns. Report summary was given to and acknowledged by the Consistory. Several recommendations were made by the Personnel Committee including:

- A recommendation that a Media Communication Team be formed to help inform all Members of events/ happenings within the Church.
- An internal audit of Church financial records be conducted.
- 3) A shadowing / apprentice program be put into place for all positions. Discussion was had that Staff Evaluations by Consistory have not been held since 2019 and should be

conducted. Discussion was held to investigate past **Church Constitutions** and the potential removal/inclusion of financial audit guidelines.

The maintenance still needed is minimal (water spots in ceiling, outside outlet, and would like to have the Parsonage rekeyed). Great team effort on the Parsonage renovation. Motion approve December 2021 Financial Report made by Chris Barger, seconded by Charles Bumgarner. Approved.

**Board of Christian Education** Committee Report given by Candace Carpenter. BoCE meetings moved to the first Sunday of each month. Suggestion to open the Nursery beginning Sunday February 6<sup>th</sup> with volunteer list - will communicate to Staff for bulletin and newsletter. The BoCE requested that all items to be purchased from BoCE budget be reviewed, price -compared and approved by the **BoCE** before purchases are made by Church Staff. Actual

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years' spend amounts for largest two line items (Sunday School Literature and VBS) were requested from Faye Painter. Requested approval to begin holding a monthly youth gathering – dates/times TBD. Motion to approve all above mentioned BoCE request made by Frank Snider, seconded by Lora Rice. All Request Approved. #### **Old Business:**

Quote #3 RJ Young, savings \$1,200 year – does include folding machine. Folding Machines can be purchased \$500-\$800 if needed.

## **Did They Move the Road?**

I asked myself that question many years ago when we moved to our former home near Carpenter's Creek, three miles south of our Church. The two main bridgon Island Ford Road (business 321) cross Carpenter's Creek at the bottom of Hanes Hill near the old Whitehouse Apple plant and Lockardt's Creek just down the hill from the Church. Lockhard's Creek is where Finger's Mill once stood.

Walking in the woods along Carpenter's Creek one day, I found an old bridge abutment about sixty feet from the current bridge. And I thought, "Golly did they move the road." They did, sort of.

When you drive south from the Church and cross Lockhardt's Creek, you can look to the right and see the former bridge supports on the banks of that creek as well. Of course, it's no mystery when you look into it. The Island Ford Road was the primary north-south route through Lincoln County in 1837 when our Church was constructed. Those two creeks were crossed at ground level in those days: no bridges. In time, however, wooden bridges constructed over the creeks. supported by the old concrete abutments you can still see today.

The Island Ford Road was the most heavily travelled road into and out of Lincolnton. So, when in 1926 Lincolnton's courthouse square was first paved, plans were made to pave the Island Ford Road north to the county line. When it came to crossing streams, it's easier to build a new bridge alongside the earlier bridge in order to allow traffic to continue flowing. A side benefit is to sometimes straighten the route slightly. Hence, the roadbed gets moved somewhat before the old bridges are abandoned or deconstructed.

These two bridges were built in the early 1930s to accommodate the newly paved road. An old county road map marked the road as NC Highway 16. That was changed in 1936 when Island Ford Road became a portion of U.S. highway 321 which today stretches more than 500 miles from Hardeeville, South Carolina to Interstate 40 southwest of Knoxville, Tennessee.

As for these two 90-year-old bridges, a 2012 road study labeled them as "functionally obsolete" considering the increased traffic load over recent decades. A proposed road plan at that time considered widening the road and replacing the bridges. As we now know, however, the plans were shelved to build a new multilane US 321 through Lincoln County.
