

Cemetery Notes ...

Did you know...our entire cemetery is mapped and indexed? Indeed, it is. That means that we know where every marked grave is located, and where some of the unmarked graves and all the vacant sites are located. The Cemetery Committee embarked on mapping and indexing the cemetery ten years ago to not only locate as many as possible available vacant sites but to help locate any unmarked graves.

Since 2013, we have located 17 previously unmarked graves. Some had nearly illegible stones, some had broken stones, and one had the headstone scattered in three places. Several graves went unmarked and the burials went In many of these unrecorded. instances, the cemetery fund paid for and the members of the cemeterv committee installed footstones because no family survivors could be located or were unwilling or unable to provide a stone. How did we locate these unmarked graves? In one or two instances we were notified by distant relatives. In other cases, we looked at unmarked deeded plots and used internet data to search death records of family for members known to have been buried in our cemetery. Most recently we had an inquiry from a genealogist family member seeking the location of the grave of Elkana Hartzoge (1815-1880). Using cemetery documents, locating family graves and studying the specific area in the old section, we located what we confidently believe is Mr. Hartzoge's unmarked grave site. It's now a matter simply of acquiring a footstone to mark his grave. And yes, there are other unmarked graves, mostly in the old section. We continue to work

on that.

All church members have an opportunity to select a grave site or columbarium niche for themselves and their spouses, even if the spouse is not a church member. Church members can also purchase deeded sites for themselves and their spouses with certain restrictions. Selecting grave sites is simply a matter of selecting the specific vacant space and filling out an assignment form. Grave site assignments are free except for columwhich require barium niches prepayment for engraving the niche plate. See any cemetery committee member for more information or request an assignment form from the committee secretary (Bud Michael). Members with assigned grave sites can exchange them for columbarium niches.

Fifty Years Ago - Bud Michael

I was thinking recently about our extensive Sanctuary upgrade and how it visually transformed the interior of our 115 year-old brick Church. The restoration revealed the beautiful pine floor and the hand-crafted bricks long hidden behind the wainscoting for so many decades; the revised choir loft and the new curved pews which add so much to the classic appearance of the Sanctuary. And the theater quality sound and video system that add so much to our worship experience.

Thinking back, I'm reminded when fifty years ago in 1973, the Church completed a previous major Sanctuary renovation. Fittingly, Reverend Linn Finger was our pastor. He is a direct descendant of Michael Finger, one of the founders of St. Matthew's.

It was in 1973 that the floors were covered with new carpeting, new upholstered pews were installed and the choir loft was constructed. The early beaded board wainscoting was covered with "modern" paneling. New windows were installed (not the stained glass windows we see today they were installed in 1984). New light fixtures were added and for comfort, air conditioning!

Reverend Finger conducted a rededication and thanksgiving service in May of 1973, commemorating the completion of the renovations.

Five years later the Education Department (the Sunday School wing) was similarly renovated using gifts, donations and volunteer labor.

Over the 185 year span of St. Matthew's existence, reconstruction, renovation and modernization have been hallmarks of a generous, dedicated and committed congregation.
