Often pastors, Sunday school teachers, and Bible scholars tell people to read the Bible, but what does this mean? What is the Bible, and how did we get this important book? First of all, the Bible isn't just simply one book, but it is made up of many books or booklets that are bound together. The Bible is made up of a total of 66 books - 39 books in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament. The books were written over hundreds of years, and then it still took hundreds of years more to make it into the form as we know it today.

The stories in the Old Testament were passed down from parents to children in an oral tradition until they were finally written down. The first 5 books of the Bible are often called the Books of Moses because they are thought to be written by Moses. Many of the books were written and stored in the temple of

Jerusalem as it was being built during King Solomon's reign. The Canon, or the collection of the books that we call the Bible today, dates back to the Reformation. This was the time period when the books were selected that make up the Bible. I am, of course, over simplifying a process that took over a thousand years.


Let us not forget where the hand of God comes in all of this. The Bible is the witness to God's word, and it is in fact, God's word. We might notice that the phrase "Word of God" is itself Amos, Hosea, Isaiah biblical. and Jeremiah all introduce their messages with "Hear the word of the Lord." In the book of John, we are told that the "Word became flesh and dwelt among us." The Bible comes together as a collection of books, yet it is much more than that. The Bible is God's word dwelling among us.

The hands of humans – humans who were inspired by God, wrote the Bible. These human hands wrote down on paper the words and thoughts that God put into their hearts and minds. The church teaches that God called the writers of scripture to a

special duty of committing their witness to writing.

So, the next time you pick up your Bible, remember that the Bible isn't a book that somehow just haphazardly came into existence. It was a long time in the making, and not only was it inspired by God - It Is The Word of God.

Those of us who haunt thrift stores, flea markets and the occasional yard sale often look for "that thing that catches the eye", perhaps a patterned dish, a first edition book, or a vintage tool. Collectors seek with purpose, which is to say, to add value to a "find".

Few if any of us expect to ever find that rare thing that makes the headlines. You know, that original copy of the US Constitution hidden behind a mundane picture in a wood frame or that once in a lifetime Navaho blanket worth zillions. Yet, exhilarating finds do sometimes occur right in the old backyard, so to speak.

Reverend Sowers was recently gifted two little vintage booklets by a former parishioner at Hedrick's Reformed Grove Church Davidson County. He said something to the effect that. "My wife saw these in a local junk store and realized one had the name of your Church printed on it." Reverend Sowers was quite excited to see they were original copies of the Minutes of the North Carolina Classis dating back more than a hundred years. You might recall that in our history book, "Six Miles Up the Island Ford Road', we noted that our founding minister, Reverend John G. Fritchey, was instrumental in organizing the North Carolina Classis in 1831. Moreover, one of the booklets was the Minutes of the 1926 North Carolina Classis meeting held at St. Matthew's Reformed Church.

Reverend Sowers, delighted with the find, said something to the effect of, "By any chance are there any more of these?" "Oh yes", he responded "She saw a whole stack. And if you want them, we'll pick them up for you."

Now, thanks to a keen eye for a rare find, Rev. Sowers adds 19 historical booklets to his collection.




CROSS OF ASHES

On Ash Wednesday, as Lent begins, worshipers' foreheads are often marked with ashes in the sign of the cross. The ashes traditionally come from burning palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. In the Old Testament. ashes were a sign of mourning and repentance. Today, some worshipers wipe off the ashes before leaving church, to symbolize being cleansed from sin by Jesus' death; others wear the ashes the rest of the day, carrying the cross of Christ into the world. **Reciting Genesis** 3:19 often accompanies the placement of ashes: "You are dust. and to dust you shall return."


